Catch of the Day	<p>Catch of the Day will set up a fishmonger service for local people and to supply their existing café situated in Cardigan on the River Teifi. The applicant will purchase fish from local fishermen and their current supplier, in Milford Haven, Pembrokeshire. This will allow them to supply seasonal fish to the local community and have a more seasonal menu for the existing café. The capital funding will be used to fit out the shop and get everything in place for fish sales. The project will also fund a full time fishmonger, one trainee who will undertake a fishmonger apprenticeship and support the existing café business, Fisherman's Rest. Due to the increase in sales that are predicted for the Fisherman's Rest café it is likely that further part time seasonal jobs will also be created, as well as indirectly supporting local fishers businesses.</p> <p>The grant of £52,000 will cover £34,000 of capital expenditure towards the fixtures and fittings needed to set up the fishmonger shop. £18,000 of revenue will then be used across the two year project to cover salaries and general running costs. Total project cost</p>	£52,100

	has been highlighted as £92,344 with the outstanding amount being generated through operating income.	
Ceredigion County Council	<p>The two year project aims to rejuvenate pleasure boat trip activity on Aberystwyth seafront. The project will enable an existing wooden jetty to be brought back into a serviceable condition, suitable for use by sightseeing boat trip operators. The Council's tourism service will advertise the availability of boat trips to Aberystwyth's visitors to enhance business growth opportunities for the boat trip operators and the visitor experience in the local area. The project will allow boat trip operators to create 3.5 FTE direct jobs and 1.6 FTE indirect jobs.
